It Is Mandatory To Notify TB

As per the Gazette Notification Government of India for prevention and elimination of the Tuberculosis:-

"The Healthcare Providers (including all PRIVATE practitioners, Laboratories, nursing homes, hospitals etc.), termed as Clinical Establishment henceforth; shall NOTIFY every TB patient to local Public Health Authority, namely, District Health Officer or Chief Medical Officer of a District and Municipal Health Officer of urban local bodies in whatever way they are known; or their designated District Tuberculosis Officers.

All Pharmacy, Chemist and Druggist dispensing anti-tubercular medicines, shall NOTIFY respective TB patients along with details of medicines".

IT'S PUNISHABLE... IF NOT NOTIFIED AND REL-EVANT PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION IS NOT TAKEN

Those failing to notify a TB patient to the concerned District TB Officer and not taking appropriate public health action after TB patient notification, will attract the provision of Sections 269 and 270 of the Indian Penal Code (45 of 1860).
